An Act to amend the Agent-General Act, 1901-1941.

[Assented to 1st November, 1945.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

Short titles.

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Agent-General Act Amendment Act, 1945".

(2) The Agent-General Act, 1901-1941, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Agent-General Act, 1901-1945".

(3) The Agent-General Act, 1901-1941, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act".

Enactment of
s. 6 of
principal Act—

2. Section 6 of the principal Act is amended so as to read as follows:—

Term of office

6. (1) Subject to subsections (2) and (3), every person appointed as Agent-General shall cease to hold office at the end of five years after the date on which his appointment takes effect.

(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1), the person holding the office of Agent-General at the twentieth day of September, nineteen hundred and forty-five, may be re-

appointed for a further term of three years commencing from the twenty-first day of September, nineteen hundred and forty-five. If the said person is so re-appointed, he shall be deemed to have held the office of Agent-General as from the twenty-first day of September, nineteen hundred and forty-five, notwithstanding that he may have been re-appointed pursuant to this subsection at a time subsequent to that day.

(3) The Agent-General may at any time be suspended or removed from office by the Governor.
