An Act to amend the Legal Practitioners Act, 1981.

[Assented to 10 November 1985]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Legal Practitioners Act Amendment Act (No. 2), 1985". Short title.

(2) The Legal Practitioners Act, 1981, is in this Act referred to as "the principal Act".

2. Section 5 of the principal Act is amended by inserting after the definition of "approved auditor" the following definition: Amendment of s. 5— Interpretation.

"Australian Government Solicitor" means the Australian Government Solicitor constituted under the *Judiciary Act* 1903 of the Commonwealth and includes any person authorized by or under that Act to act in the name of the Australian Government Solicitor.

3. Section 21 of the principal Act is amended by striking out from paragraph (w) of subsection (3) the passage "or of the Attorney-General or Crown Solicitor of the State or the Commonwealth" and substituting the passage "the Attorney-General of the State or of the Commonwealth, the Crown Solicitor or the Australian Government Solicitor". Amendment of s. 21— Entitlement to practise.

4. Section 51 of the principal Act is amended—

(a) by striking out paragraph (a) of subsection (1) and substituting the following paragraph: Amendment of s. 51— Right of audience.

(a) the Attorney-General and the Solicitor-General of the State or of the Commonwealth, the Crown Solicitor and the Australian Government Solicitor;;

and

- (b) by striking out from paragraph (b) of subsection (1) the passage "or the Crown Solicitor of the State or of the Commonwealth" and substituting the passage "of the State or of the Commonwealth or on the instructions of the Crown Solicitor or the Australian Government Solicitor".
