An Act to amend "The Post Office Act, 1876."

[Assented to, November 18th, 1881.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Post Office Act, 1876"—Be it therefore Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows: Preamble.

1. Sections 17 and 18 of "The Post Office Act, 1876," are hereby repealed. Repeal.

2. The sum of One Halfpenny shall be prepaid for every newspaper posted in South Australia. Postage of ½d. on all newspapers not entitled to free delivery.

3. Section 19 of "The Post Office Act, 1876," shall be read as if the words "shall be deemed a newspaper" were inserted after the word "advertisement" in line 3, and as if the word "unstitched" had been omitted from the said section. Amendment of section 19 of "The Post Office Act, 1876."

4. This Act may be cited as the "Post Office Act Amendment Act, 1881." Short title.

5. This Act shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two. Commencement of Act.
