SIR MARK OLIPHANT:

The Premier, Mr. Dunstan, said tonight he was delighted by the announcement that the Queen had appointed Sir Mark Oliphant as South Australia's new Governor:

"Sir Mark is a most distinguished South Australian, an internationally-renowned scientist and a man of deep humanitarian beliefs.

"We are fortunate that a man of his eminence has been able to take up this appointment.
