## ROYAL VISIT, 1974

The outline program for the Royal Visit from March 1 to 5, 1974, was announced by the Premier, Mr Dunstan, yesterday.

Her Majesty the Queen and His Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh will arrive at Adelaide Airport on Friday, March 1. They will be welcomed by the Governor, Sir Mark Oliphant, and Lady Oliphant, and the Premier. The Queen will inspect a guard of honour.

The Royal visitors will then leave for the Adelaide Town Hall, where a civic welcome will be given before they arrive at Government House for lunch.

That evening the Queen and the Duke will attend a banquet in connection with the University of Adelaide Centenary Celebrations at Chrysler Australia Ltd., Clovelly Park. The Queen will officially open the centenary celebrations.

At the Festival Theatre on Saturday night, March 2, the Duke of Edinburgh will attend a University function, at which he will deliver an address.

On Monday, March 4, the Royal couple will visit Murray Bridge in connection with the 50th Jubilee Celebrations of that town becoming a municipality.

The Queen and the Duke will leave for Western Australia on Tuesday, March 5.

The Premier said a program of additional engagements during the visit had been discussed by the State Director of the Royal Visit, Mr T.M. Barr, with the Assistant Private Secretary to the Queen, Mr W. Heseltine, in Adelaide recently.
