An Act to amend the Police Pensions Act, 1929.

[Assented to, 8th October, 1936.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows :

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Police Pensions Act Amendment Act, 1936." Short titles.

(2) The Police Pensions Acts, 1929 to 1932, and this Act may be cited together as the "Police Pensions Acts, 1929 to 1936."

2. This Act is incorporated with the Police Pensions Acts, 1929 to 1932, and those Acts and this Act shall be read as one Act. Incorporation

3. Subsection (1) of section 18 of the Police Pensions Act, 1929, is amended by striking out at the end thereof the words "which he earned during that month" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "by which the total of the monthly amount of his pension (leaving out of account any reduction under this section) and of his earnings during that month, exceeds the monthly amount of his salary immediately prior to his retirement." Amendment of principal Act, s. 18—
Abatement of pension.

4. (1) Section 22 of the Police Pensions Act, 1929, is amended by striking out the word "fifty-two" in the second line thereof and inserting in lieu thereof the word "ninety." Amendment of s. 22 of principal Act—
Increase of widows' pensions.

Police Pensions Act Amendment Act.—1936.

(2) The increase in pensions effected by this section shall apply, as from the passing of this Act, to pensions entered upon by widows of members and widows of pensioners before the passing of this Act, as well as to pensions entered on by those persons after the passing of this Act.
