An Act relating to certain Railway Crossings on the Adelaide to Gawler Town Railway Line.

[Assented to, December 21st, 1922.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows :

1. This Act may be cited as the "Railway Crossings (Bowden) Act, 1922." Short title.

2. (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in any Act, the South Australian Railways Commissioner may, forthwith upon the passing of this Act, stop and close the roads shown upon the plan deposited in the office of the Surveyor-General at Adelaide, signed "F. W. Stephen, Chief Engineer for Railways", and dated the seventeenth day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty-two, at the two points of intersection by the railway constructed pursuant to the Adelaide to Gawler Town Railway Act, which two points are marked on the said plan "A" and "B" respectively. Railways Commissioner may stop and close certain level crossings. No. 18 of 1854.

(2) Upon the closing of the said roads as aforesaid, the two pieces of land delineated in the said plan and each therein colored green shall vest in the said Commissioner in his corporate capacity for an estate of inheritance in fee simple.

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
