An Act to apply, out of the General Revenue, the sum of Four Hundred Thousand Pounds to the Service of the Three Months ending the Thirtieth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and seven.

[Assented to, July 31st, 1907.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

1. Out of the General Revenue of South Australia there shall be issued and applied, from time to time, for the service of the three months ending the thirtieth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and seven, any sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of Four Hundred Thousand Pounds.

Issue and application of £400,000.

2. No payments for any establishment or service shall be made out of the said sum in excess of the rates voted for similar establishments or services on the Estimates for the year ended the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and seven, except so far as such rates are affected by the "Civil Service Act, 1874," or by departmental regulations.

Payments not to exceed last year's Estimates.

Exception.

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
