Act to amend "The Stamp Act Amendment Act, 1902."

And see No. 885 of 1905.

[Assented to, October 30th, 1903.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament of the said State, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited for all purposes as the "Stamp Act Further Amendment Act, 1903," and shall be incorporated and read with "The Stamp Act, 1886," and all Acts amending the same. Short title.

2. The Second Schedule of "The Stamp Act Amendment Act, 1902," is hereby amended as follows:— Amendment of Act of 1902.

(a) Under the heading "Agreement not under seal (not otherwise specifically charged)," after sub-section 3, add the following sub-section:—

4. Any life, fire, personal accident, fidelity, guarantee, live stock, plate glass, or marine insurance, or assurance policy, or cover note: Life and fire policies exempted.

(b) Under the heading "General Exemptions from all Stamp Duties" add the following:—

5. Storage notes for wheat in form in the Schedule hereto, or to like effect only.

18. Any transfer of any fire, personal accident, fidelity, guarantee, live stock, plate glass, or marine insurance or assurance policy: Transfer of policies exempted.

19. Any cemetery leases:

(c) Under

- (c) Under the heading "Bill of Exchange of any kind whatsoever and Promissory Note of every kind whatsoever, drawn or expressed to be payable, or actually paid or indorsed, or in any manner negotiated in South Australia," after the words "drawn in South Australia" add the words—"other than bills on demand."
- (d) Under the heading "Affidavit or Declaration when sworn or declared and subscribed before a Stipendiary Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, Commissioner for Taking Affidavits or Notary Public," after sub-section 6 add the following:—
7. Relating to any bonus for the destruction of wild dogs, foxes, or other vermin, or with respect to any vermin rate.

Bill or promissory
note may be stamped
within fourteen days.

3. When any bill or promissory note other than a bill of exchange or promissory note payable on demand has not been stamped, or has been insufficiently stamped, the holder may, within fourteen days from the date thereof, by paying the duty or such deficiency to the Commissioner, have such bill of exchange or promissory note duly stamped.
