An Act to amend the Swine Compensation Act,  
1936-1954.

[Assented to 19th May, 1960.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows :

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Swine Compensation Act Amendment Act, 1960". Short titles.

(2) The Swine Compensation Act, 1936-1954, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Swine Compensation Act, 1936-1960".

(3) The Swine Compensation Act, 1936-1954, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act".

2. This Act is incorporated with the principal Act and that Act and this Act shall be read as one Act. Incorporation.

3. The definition of "disease" in section 4 of the principal Act is amended— Amendment of principal Act, s. 4— Interpretation.

(a) by inserting therein after the expression "swine erysipelas," the words "infectious rhinitis"; and

(b) by adding at the end of the said definition the words "and any other disease whether of the like nature or not affecting swine which the Governor has for the time being declared by proclamation to be a disease for the purposes of this Act."

**4.** The following section is inserted in the principal Act after section 4 thereof :—

Proclamation  
of disease.

**4a.** (1) The Governor may from time to time by proclamation declare any disease affecting swine to be a disease for the purposes of this Act.

(2) The Governor may from time to time by proclamation declare that any disease proclaimed as such by a previous proclamation shall cease to be a disease for the purposes of this Act. Any such disease may subsequently be again declared by proclamation to be a disease for the purposes of this Act.

**5.** The amendment effected by paragraph (a) of section 3 of this Act shall be deemed to have come into operation on the first day of December, one thousand, nine hundred and fifty-nine.
