PRESS RELEASE BY THE PREMIER, HON. DON DUNSTAN, Q.C. M.P.

\$350,000 will be spent by Messenger Newspapers on an expansion programme which is due to commence this month.

This plan was announced by the Premier, Mr. Dunstan, today.

The premises at Port Adelaide will be enlarged and a Goss Urbanite Rotary Offset Press will be installed. This is the largest offset press of its kind in Australasia and in addition to being used for the printing of suburban newspapers, it is also capable of printing coloured newspapers, bulletins and magazines of a high quality. The press is due to arrive in January.

The new Plant will enable Messenger Newspapers to print a number of South Australian publications that are now printed in the eastern States and also to compete for the printing of the larger publications now published and printed in New South Wales and Victoria.

The Messenger Group has a staff of over 150 full-time employees.
