An Act for granting to Her Majesty certain increased Duties of Customs.

[Assented to, November 21st, 1894.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows: Preamble.

1. In addition to the duties of Customs authorised by Act No. 405 of 1887, and now levied upon the importation of the goods mentioned in the Schedule to this Act, there shall be levied, collected, and paid to Her Majesty, upon the importation of the said goods into the Province of South Australia, duties at the rate set forth in the said Schedule. Increased duties.

2. The Collector of Customs and all officers of Customs are hereby indemnified, protected, and held harmless against any action, claim, or damage to which he or they might otherwise have been liable by reason of any refusal to deliver any goods imported into the said province after the ninth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, or in bond on that day, without payment of the duties set forth in the Schedule hereto. 3. Every person who shall, on or before the commencement of this Act, have made or entered into any contract or agreement for the sale or delivery upon or at any time after the ninth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, of any of the goods mentioned in the Schedule to this Act, shall be at liberty to add Duty on articles contracted for before commencement of this Act.

add to the price contracted for so much money as will be equivalent to the additional duty which shall by reason of the provisions of this Act have been paid or made payable on such goods, and shall be entitled by virtue of this Act to be paid the same accordingly by the purchaser of such article, and to sue for and recover the same against such purchaser.

Act to be read in conjunction with
No. 405 of 1887.

4. This Act may be cited as “The Customs Amendment Act, 1894,” and shall be read and construed with and as an amendment of Act No. 405 of 1887, “An Act to repeal the present Customs Tariff, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof, and for other purposes.”

Fruits, Dried (except currants) ..	Per pound	One penny
Wine, Still	Per gallon	Six shillings
Wine, Sparkling	Per gallon	Five shillings
Spirits of all kinds, the strength of which can be ascertained by Sykes' hydrometer	Per proof gallon	One shilling
Spirits, Perfumed	Per proof gallon	One shilling
Spirits and spirituous compounds (on all), the strength of which cannot be ascertained by Sykes' hydrometer	Per liquid gallon	One shilling
Spirits, Methylated	Per liquid gallon	One shilling
Beer in bottle	Per gallon	Sixpence
Beer in bulk	Per gallon	Twopence
