An Act to amend the Law relating to the Protection of Children.

[Assented to, November 24th, 1904.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "The Children's Protection Amendment Act, 1904," and shall be incorporated and read and construed as one Act with "The Children's Protection Act, 1899," and all Acts amending the same.

Short title and incorporation.

2. Any person who shall sell, lend, or give, or offer to sell, lend, or give, to any child actually or apparently under the age of sixteen years any tobacco, cigar, or cigarette, shall be guilty of an offence under this Act, and shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Five Pounds.

Persons supplying tobacco, &c., liable to penalty.

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
