Good evening,

The Australian Labor Party has in the past 3 years established a number of committees of its federal conference to program, in detail its policies for the next federal election.

The A.L.P subjects its policies to close and continual scrutiny & is always prepared to set them first in detail for the election. It is strange to read in the Advertiser of the Labor Party being urged to re-think its policies – it is always doing just that.
