The State Government is to sponsor two representatives to the International Women's Year Tribune in Mexico City from June 19 to July 2, 1975.

Applications have been called from South Australian residents, both women and men, for the two places. The representatives will be chosen for the contribution they will make to community affairs and their involvement in the women's movement. Preference will be given to applicants who would not be able to attend without financial assistance.

The representatives will be chosen by a committee appointed by the Premier. Mr. Dunstan said today that the committee would specially welcome applications from migrant and black women, factory workers, student teachers and other such persons.

The cost for the two will be approximately \$2,500 which will include fares, accommodation and a living allowance.

The Tribune will bring together people from all United Nations countries to explore topics ranging from women's role in food production for the world to men's stake in women's advancement. There will be talks, group discussions, films and exhibitions. The organisers hope that hundreds of people with diverse backgrounds and experience will attend.

The Tribune is open to all interested people and will run concurrently with an inter-Governmental Conference to which the Australian Government will send official delegates.

Australian travel agencies are organising special tours for the occasion with costs as low as \$900 to include return fares, accommodation and sight-seeing.
